Mid-Year Corvette Door Lock Removal

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


To remove the lock cylinder you must disconnect the lock rod from the locking mechanism by removing the lock-rod clip on the bottom of the rod. You must disengage the small tab from the hole in the locking mechanism (below right) to slide the clip free. Then, remove the rod and slide the lock retainer clip from the cylinder. It might be pretty tight as there are small teeth where it engages with the flanges on the cylinder.

Note from JohnZ on the CF: "There are **NO GASKETS** behind the door lock cylinder escutcheon that's why they don't show in the Assembly Manual; pitch the gaskets and you'll be able to install the retainer clips."










Door lock pawl and retainer
